All Fisheries Service's divisions dedicated for fisheries enforcement and control are based in the Fisheries Service main office in Klaipeda.

b) co-operation between different authorities and allocation of tasks for various authorities in the implementation of the IUU Regulation (Fisheries, Health, Customs, Coast Guard, Navy, etc.).

Among examples of best practices relating to the enforcement of the IUU Regulation cooperation—both interinstitutional and international—is being implemented. As regards interinstitutional cooperation, the Fisheries Service mainly cooperates with another competent national institution in fighting IUU fishing, the Customs Department, because both are involved in control of fisheries products which are placed on national market. Constant exchange of information, joint capacity building workshops (organized annually) are being implemented. In addition, cooperation strengthening with Lithuanian State Border Guard Service and the Ministry of Interior is ongoing for the future actions for joint inspection and surveillance actions. As well cooperation agreement is in force with Lithuanian Naval Forces, and with Lithuanian Transport Safety Administration.
