Comparing the report for 2020-2021 with the report for the period 2018-2019, the following aspects were observed: (data are reported in number of CC catch certificates):

Regarding the import of fish and fishery products (CC), it was observed:

- In the top 10 flag states that exported to Romania fish and fishery products in the years 2020-2021, with a maximum volume of imports were: Canada 25% of the total, Morocco 9%, Philippine and Vietnam 8%, Panama and Indonesia 7%, Ecuador and China 5%, Korea and USA 4%, the rest of the imports from the flag states were below 4%. The emergence of new imports from countries such as: Seychelles with 10 CC, Mauritius and Turkey each with 2 CC, Iceland, Kiribati, Mauritania with 1 CC each.

- There was a significant increase in the volume of imports from countries such as El Salvador, Panama, India, a slight increase for China and the USA and a decrease in imports from Indonesia, Peru, Philippines, Cape Verde, New Zealand. A slight decrease for Ecuador, Taiwan, Thailand, the disappearance of imports from the Maldives, Tunisia, Uruguay, Norway.

- The minimum volume of imports with 1 validated CC was recorded by the countries of the authorities of Oman, Iceland, Kiribati, Mauritania, New Zealand.

- A large increase in the volume of imports of hake trunks was recorded by the Canadian authority, an increase of 238 CC compared to the previous period and the disappearance of the mackerel trunk and red perch.

With regard to the processing of fishery products (Annex IV) it was noted:

- The increase in the volume of fishery products processed in Ecuador, Vietnam, Papua New Guinea, Cape Verde and the decrease in the volume of processed products in Thailand, followed by a slight decrease in processed products in China;

- The emergence of new third countries with origin processing plants: Seychelles, Colombia, Mauritius, Canada, Korea and the disappearance of processed fishery products in countries such as the Philippines, Norway, Morocco, Tunisia.

Regarding imported fish species and fishery products, the following were observed:

- Emergence of new species such as Pacific mackerel - Cololabis Saira, dolphin fish - Coryphaena Hippurus and flying squid - Nototodarus Sloanii and the disappearance of red perch -Sebastes Alutus and oily fish - Lepidocybium flavobrunneum.

Regarding the import of preserves, it was observed:

- Increasing the volume of canned tuna processed in factories with a number of 301 CC compared to 190 CC from 2018-2019. Significant growth was recorded from processing plants originating in Ecuador with 212 CC validated compared to the previous period in which only 70 CC were verified. The processed tuna was fished in countries such as El Salvador, Spain, France, Nicaragua and Panama.
