The unit for Fisheries Inspections is responsible for inspection in ports. FMC issues catch certificates for exportation and perform administrative controls. The Unit for Data monitoring and analysis has a coordinating role and performs verifications of catch certificates.

If yes, please detail: The levels of the administrative sanctions follows from the provisions of addendum 1 and 2 of the Fisheries Ordinance (1994:1716). The vast majority of infringements result in a set amount but does not take into account the value of the catch with the lowest amount being 2 000 SEK per infringement.

In regards to some infringements, for example infringements against article 6 of the IUU-regulation, the level of the administrative sanction shall instead be set at a level depending on the length of the vessel. For vessels under 12 meter the amount is 5 000 SEK. For vessels over 12 meter but under 24 meter the amount is 10 000 SEK. For vessels over 24 meter the amount is 25 000 SEK. The reasoning behind these levels is that larger vessels have the capacity to carry larger catches which in the event of an infringement may cause more harm than if the same infringement was committed by a smaller vessel.

Finally, there are some infringements where the level of the administrative sanction is calculated so as to correspond to twice the value of the catch (with a minimum amount of at least 5 000 SEK) instead of being set at a fixed level. This level of sanction shall be used in cases of non-reporting in a logbook, omission of information of species or amount of catch, or in cases where one species has been wrongfully reported as another species (including in connection with a recording of a landing or transhipment according to article 8 in the IUU-regulation).

Have you used criminal sanctions? If yes, please specify if in addition to or in replacement of administrative sanctions: Yes, in one of the cases from 2020 the master of the vessel was sentenced to a criminal fine of 11 000 SEK as well as assigned points. The Swedish legal system does not allow for criminal fines in addition to administrative sanctions for the same offence.
